Submissions are limited in length for several reasons- to focus on the story and not the history behind the story. The collection will do that piece by piece.

Electronic submissions are ideal. This allows for greater portability.

Submissions are subject to editorial review. Changes may be made without authorization. Submitting your content ensure that you understand this as such.
